<u>CELA</u> (Canadian Environmental Law Foundation) <u>CELA</u> is a specialty legal clinic within the Ontario-wide network of clinics funded by Legal Aid Ontario. We provide free legal services to people and groups across Ontario that qualify for legal aid.
